AUBURN, ALA.—Auburn University will award a total of 1,791 degrees this month on its two campuses. Robert Newton Campbell, III, of Edenton, N.C., will be among those receiving degrees on June 7.

Highlight of the 11:30 A.M. worship service will be an address by Dr. Thomas E. Carter, Assistant to Elizabeth City State University's Chancellor, Dr. Marion D. Thorpe.

Dr. Carter, who is also a Professor of Mathematics at ECSU, has an extensive background in education, counseling, curriculum development and administration, being listed with the U.S. Office of Education as a Specialist in Inner-City Education. A graduate of Virginia State College and Temple University, he has held positions in Charles City, Va., Philadelphia, Pa., as well as at Virginia State.

While in Philadelphia, Dr. Carter served as a tutor for inner-city children at the Martin Luther King Community Center, the First Presbyterian Church, a Catholic Church in North Philadelphia, and in private homes. He also served as a "Big Brother" to a fatherless boy in Wayne, Pa., for two years, and still maintains that relationship on a limited basis.

Awarded the Order of Merit by the Robert E. Lee Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Dr. Carter is a member of the American Association of University Professors, the Mathematics Association of America, the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics and numerous other professional, civic and

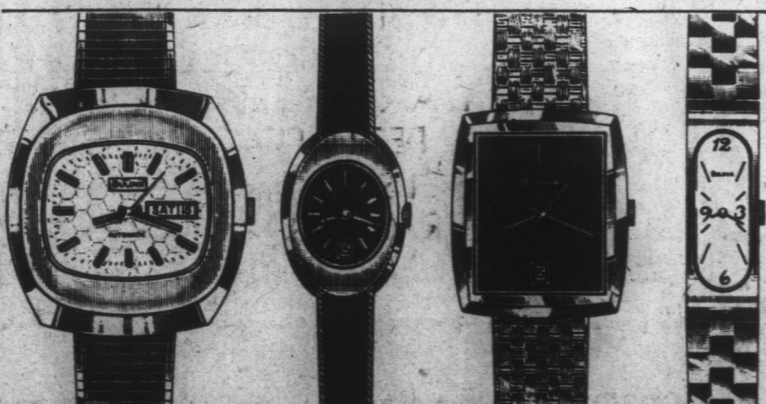
