Rules, Regulations Topic Of CRC Hearing

The Coastal Resources Commission has scheduled a meeting at the Ramada Inn in New Bern for June 21 and 22. An opening session will begin at 9 A.M. on June 21. At 10 A.M. the commission will conduct a public hearing on behalf of the Secretary of Natural and Economic Resources. The

subject of the hearing will be "Rules and Regulations Relating to Generally Applicable Grant Criteria and Procedures for Local Implementation and Enforcement Programs."

There will be afternoon sessions of the commission's two standing committees (Implementation and Operations, and Environmental).

Comments received in connection with the 20 public hearings held recently on Proposed Areas of Environmental Concern and amendments to the "State Guidelines" will be reviewed and considered by the Environmental Committee, and recommendations on AECs finalized.

Also, there will be discussion on the status of review and consultation on the Draft North Carolina Coastal Plan.

The commission will

reconvene for a plenary session, with committee reports and actions, 9 A.M. - 12-noon on June 22, at which time the commission expects to designate areas of environmental concern and adopt AEC Guideline

amendments. The Executive Secretary's Office in Raleigh can be contacted for further information.
