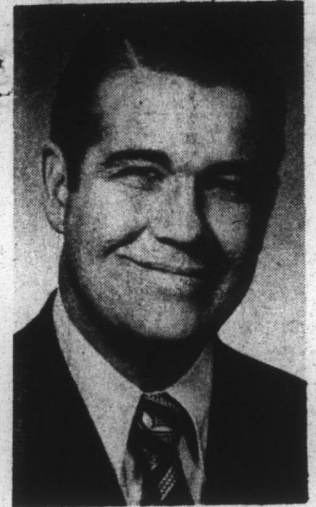


Students Earn Various Awards

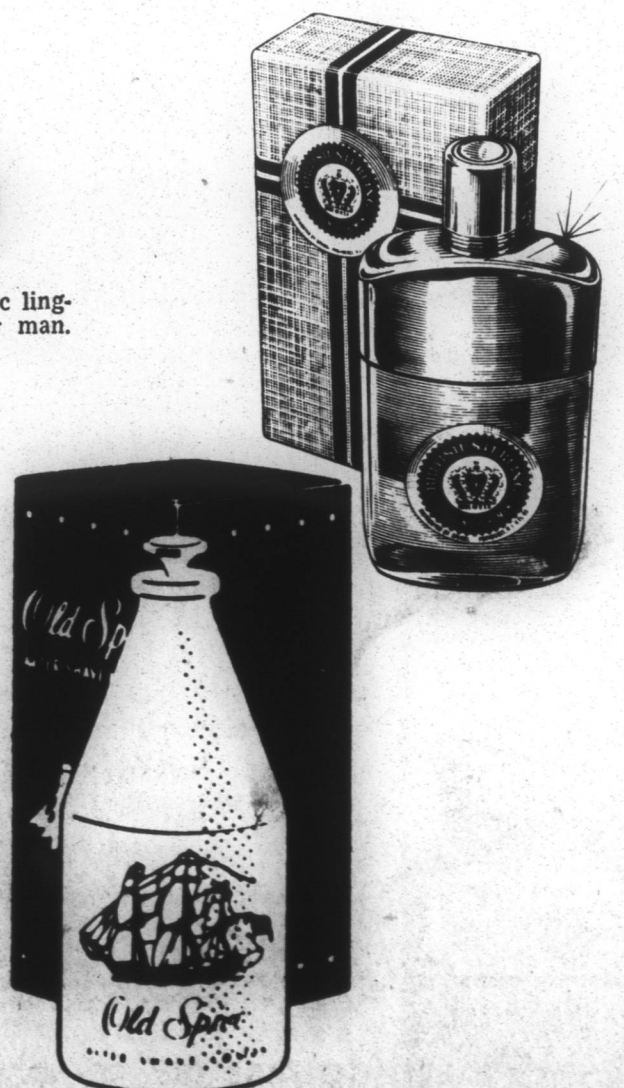
