We will have a referendum held on April 6th throughout the state of North Carolina to vote on corn, hogs, and eggs. The polling places for this referendum will be at the ASCS office, Hoskin Harrell's Store, Leary Brothers, Vahlala Produce,

W.E. Smith's Store, and C.A. Perry & Son. Young Farmers and Ranchers have agreed to hold the polls which will open at 7:00 A.M. and close at 6:00 P.M.

The corn referendum farmers will be voting to assess themselves 1/4 cent per bushel for the corn they sell to be used for research and marketing. Harold Lloyd Bunch,

The following is the recommendations for grass, weed, and insect control for corn in 1978: (See the enclosed information.)

Remember, the height of the boom reflects in spray pattern.

For your information: Corn planted on 38" rows, 6" apart is 27,510 plants; 7" equals 23,581 plants; 8" equals 20,632 plants; 9" equals 16,506 plants. On 40" rows, 6" apart is 26,134 plants; 7" equals 22,402 plants; 8" equals 19,600 plants; and 9" equals 17,422 plants.

Be sure to knock holes in all pesticide cans before you take them to the landfill. They cannot take them otherwise. This means top, bottom, and sides.

GRASS AND WEED CONTROL - USE AGITATION AT ALL TIMES		
Chemical	Broadcast	Comments
Pre-plant Sutan	2-3 Gal.	Incorporate - controls nutgrass. Weak on cocklebur & morning glory
Sutan	2-3 Gal.	Incorporate - controls nutgrass, crabgrass, most weeds - some Fall Panicum
AAtrex	2 Lbs.	
Pre-emergence AAtrex (Atrazine)	2-3 Lbs.	Before grass & weeds are 1". Controls most grass & weeds except Panicum or barnyard grass.
Atrazine	1 1/2-2 Lbs.	Controls most grass and weeds except nutgrass.
Lasso	2 Qts.	
Bladex 80 WP	2-4 Lbs.	Lasts about 6 weeks; check label for organic soil rates. Rotary hoe if dry.
80 WP	1-3/4 - 4 lbs./gal.	
Lasso	2-3 Qts.	Controls most grass & weeds. Weak on cocklebur & morning glory. Do not mix with nitrogen after corn is up.
Lasso Bladex 80 WP	1/2 Gal.	Lasts about 6 weeks; check label for organic soil rates. Do not use if organic is less than 1%. Rotary hoe if dry.
Princep	2 1/2 Lbs.	Controls most weeds & grass including Fall Panicum. Needs rain within a week or need to incorporate lightly.
Princep + AAtrex	1 1/2 Lbs. each	
Dual	3-4 Pints	Light control some nutgrass. Most annual grasses including Fall Panicum, smooth crabgrass, and Pigweed. Poor on other broadleaf weeds.
Post-emergence 2,4-D Amine with water (seesale tip 8001 or 78) with water	1 Pint	If used with nitrogen, mix 2,4-D with water 1 to 4. Use 23-25 lbs. pressure at 1400. Spray when corn is 2-3" high with drop nozzle. Controls most weeds and morning glory.
Chemical	Broadcast	Comments
Lorox	1-2 Lbs.	Use as clean up, can be used with nitrogen. Drop nozzle.
Basagran	1-2 Pts.	Apply early when weeds are small and corn has 1 to 2 leaves.
Evik	1-1 1/2 lbs.	Use as clean up; can be used with nitrogen. Drop nozzle.
