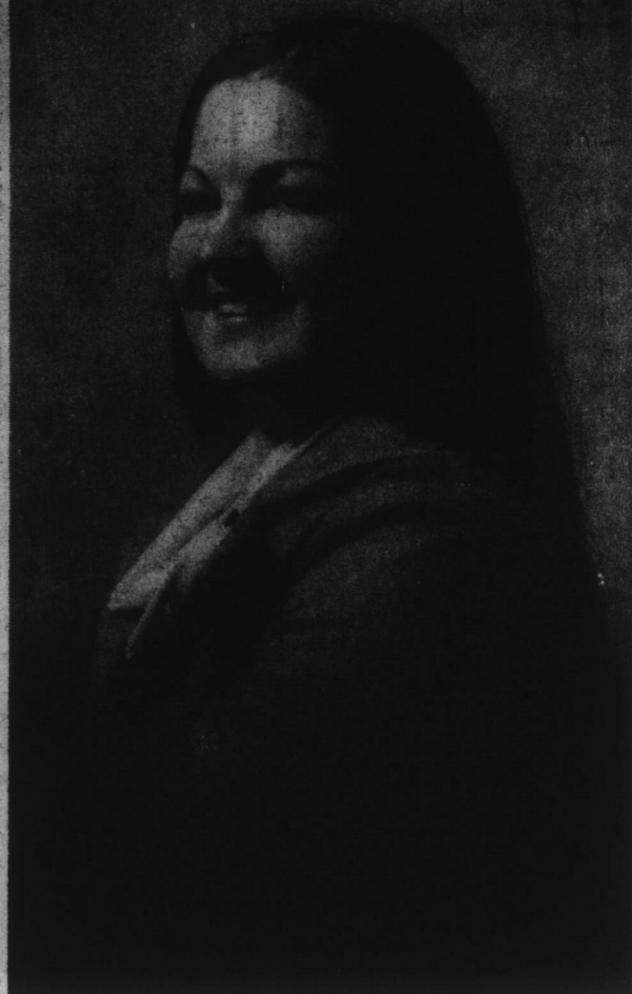
Following the ceremony the parents of the bride entertained at a reception in the church fellowship hall.
