mty Ext. Chairman crotinia Blight on its for the past several ars has been a real oblem in Virginia and has adually moved into North olina. We have found ome of it in Chowan County his year for the first time it has been identified. It has a cottony, white mold with black seed spores.

Following are recom-mendations for this disease:

1. Apply Botran 75W with 8008 or 8010 LP nozzles (onerow) at or just below leaf canopy height. Spray must reach the soil surface and cover all tissue in close proximity with the soil. Consequently, large droplets rather than a mist will be necessary to get the chemical to the soil surface and also get thorough coverage of all plant tissue. Adjust tractor speed and spray pressure so you deliver 30 or more gallons of water per acre. Be sure to adjust volume for 36-inch nozzle spacing instead of 20inch spacing as shown in most spray charts.
2. Botran 75W can be

applied from mid-July through September, depending on weather conditions and the presence of infestation. Therefore, apply Botran 75W when disease first appears in each field. Fields with prior history of blight may be sprayed when disease first appears in your locale. (We will keep your county agricultural agent appraised of the disease situation.)

3. Applications prior to August 15 should be made at the rate of 2.5 lbs. of product (Botran 75W) per acre. This

5. Cool, weat weather conditions in August and September favor this disease. Growers should keep a close watch on their crop during this period.

Restrictions
1. Do not apply Botran
75W to peanuts after September 30.

2. Applications of Botran 75W in a given field must not exceed a total of 5 lbs.-acre.

3. Botran-treated vines or hay must not be used as livestock feed. 4. A minimum of 30

days pre-harvest interval must be observed. All applicable label directions, precautions and restrictions must be
