

Some employers of agricultural workers are apparently unaware of minimum wage requirements, according to the U.S. Department of Labor.

"This year for the first recommended that four time," says James E. Patching, regional administrator for employment standards, Atlanta, "agricultural workers covered by the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) must be paid the same minimum wage - \$2.65 per hour - as other categories of covered workers.'

In order to be covered by the FLSA, an agricultural employee must work for an employer who used more than 500 man-days of agricultural labor in any calendar quarter of the preceding calendar year. Additional information is available from the U.S. Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division, which has area offices in Raleigh, Greensboro and Charlotte.
