

Wrestling Team Winning

The Aces wrestling team has wrestled six matches and one tournament over the last month. In the matches, the Aces fared well, winning five of six. Their only loss came to last year's conference champions, Plymouth, while they registered conference wins over Williamston, Washington, Ahoskie, and Tarboro. The other win was a non-conference victory over Northeastern of Elizabeth City.

Edenton's scoring during their 46-28 loss was provided by 4 pins and a major decision. Jackson (1:31, 2nd), Rome (1:10, 2nd), Bonner (1:25, 1st) and W. Coffield (36, 3rd) registered pins as Raleigh Basnight won a 12-3 decision.

The Aces started their present five match winning streak back in mid-December with a 56-12 win over Williamston. Forfeits to Bemby, Stepany, Perry and Skittlethorpe, pins by Carter (:31, 1st), T. Lassiter (:59, 1st) and W. Coffield (:50, 1st) and decision wins by I. Basnight (7-2), Rome (13-6), R. Basnight (17-1) and Bonner (7-4) provided Edenton's scoring.

The next match, against Washington, was a cliff-hanger and very much in doubt until the 195 pound weight class, where Maddred won a 10-5 decision to ice the victory. Other Edenton scoring in the 36-33 thriller was provided by one forfeit, pins by Carter (:55, 1st), Jackson (1:46, 3rd), Rome (1:56, 1st), and T. Lassiter (:34, 3rd), and one other decision win by Basnight 18-1.

The next three matches were won by wide margins, the first of these being a 49-23 drubbing of Northeastern. With 2 forfeits, 2 pins (by Rome (:50, 3rd) and W. Coffield (:40, 1st) and 4 decisions, one of them major, (Jackson, 11-1; R. Basnight, 7-2; Bonner, 3-0;

and Maddred, 5-3), the Eagles were overcome. Yet they fared much better than the Aces first opponent of 1979, the Ahoskie Cougars.

The Aces slipped by Ahoskie 66-9 with three forfeits and pins by Bemby (1:29, 3rd), Stepany (:41, 2nd), Jackson (:25, 1st), I. Basnight (1:15, 1st), Rome (1:37, 1st), C. Hill (1:57, 2nd), R. Basnight (1:25, 1st), and Bonner (1:27, 1st).

The Aces next victim was Tarboro in a rematch that was no match. The 70 points the Aces collected in their 70-9 win came on 4 forfeits, pins by Carter (1:50, 2nd), Jackson (:11, 1st) Rome (:57, 2nd), R. Basnight (1:57, 2nd) and Bonner (:55, 1st), and superior decisions by Holley (19-3) and Lassiter (14-2).

The Aces also fared very well in the Tournament last Saturday in Plymouth. The eight team tournament featured Edenton, Plymouth, Manteo, Cape Hatteras, Greenville Rose, Northern Nash, North Pitt, and New Bern. Edenton came in second behind Plymouth with four first place finishers in 13 weight classes. Of the ten Edenton wrestlers who entered, nine placed. They are as follows:
