

**Educator Guest Speaker**

WINDSOR — Frederick D. Nichols, a noted educator and lecturer of architectural history from Charlottesville, Va., will be the guest speaker at the Friends of Hope Committee's annual business meeting scheduled at Hope Plantation on September 22.

Nichols will address the more than 50 Friends of Hope and their guests expected to arrive here for the 10:30 A.M. meeting and subsequent luncheon.

Alongstanding member of the architectural historian community, Nichols has conducted extensive research into the architectural influences of Thomas Jefferson to whom his contemporary, David Stone, early North Carolina governor and builder of Hope Plantation, has been likened.

Nichols was instrumental in the successful restoration of the Rotunda, a Jefferson-inspired building, at the University of Virginia at Charlottesville.

In addition, Nichols is credited with a significant role in developing the Bicentennial "Eye of Jefferson" exhibit, displayed at the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D. C., in 1976.

Nichols, a native of Trinidad, Colo., received his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Yale University in 1935. He was regional director from 1935-41 of the Historic Buildings Survey conducted by the National Park Service. From 1946 to 1950, he served as head of the Architectural Studies program conducted by the University of Hawaii.

Since 1972, Nichols, 68, has served as chairman of the Division of Architectural History at the University of Virginia, created from the earlier Division of Art and Architecture over which he presided from 1965-70. He is also a professor of art and architecture at the university, a position he has held since 1961, and has been a Cary D. Langhorne professor since 1967.

This year's committee chairman is L. A. Bailey of Rocky Mount, succeeding Mrs. Ernest L. Ives of Southern Pines, who resigned this year after serving as chairman since 1967.

Co-chairman of the Friends Committee is Mrs. Marian C. Perry of Colerain. Honorary chairman is North Carolina's current First Lady, Mrs. James B. Hunt, Jr.

A foremost project among many already underway through the committee's efforts is rebuilding Gov. David Stone's library, with research based on the more than 1,400 volumes listed by title in the governor's estate inventory.

Also ranking a high priority is restoration of the King-Bazemore house, for which the foundation bricks have arrived.

Other continuing projects undertaken by the Friends of Hope include endowments, acquisition of furnishings and landscaping the Hope Plantation estate.

The business meeting will be preceded by a subscription musicale, to be performed by the string quartet of the N. C. Symphony.
