announced that juniors will be able to join over 1-million other students around the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test-National Merit Scholarship Qaulifying Test (PSAT-NMSQT) this fall. The test, cosponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation, is an important step in making college plans.

Scheduled for Saturday at PSAT-NMSQT measures verbal and mathematical aptitude -- two abilities important in doing college work - and gives students a chance to find out what the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) is like.

By taking the PSAT-NMSQT, students can enter competition for scholarships administered by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation and ask to participate in the College Board's Student Search Service, which gives students an opportunity to hear from colleges that they might not otherwise know about

With their score reports, students receive a copy of About Your PSAT-NMSQT Scores, a booklet that contains valuable how-to information about estimating SAT scores, finding out where to get and how to use detailed in-

# Deadline For Peanut Program Recommendations Is Announced

Agriculture is required to announce by December 1 a national acreage allotment of no less than 1,614,000 acres and a 1980 national poundage quota of not less than 1,516,000 short tons (3,032-million pounds).

The secretary may increase the quota if for any marketing year he determines estimated respectively. requirements for domestic







