Deadline For Peanut Program Recommendations Is Announced

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The public has until November 15 to make recommendations for the 1980-crop peanut program. Ray Fitzgerald, administrator of ASCS said on September 28.

Consideration will be given to written comments on the following:
 —the amount of the national acreage allotment;
 —the amount of the national poundage quota;

and —the apportionment of such allotment to states.
 The Secretary of Agriculture is required to announce by December 1 a 1980 national acreage allotment of no less than 1,614,000 acres and a 1980 national poundage quota of not less than 1,516,000 short tons (3,032-million pounds).

The national poundage quota will establish the quantity of 1980-crop peanuts eligible for loan at the domestic edible support rate.

The secretary may increase the quota if for any marketing year he determines estimated requirements for domestic edible use and a reasonable

carryover will require additional production. Under the 1979 peanut program, the national acreage allotment and the poundage quota were established at the legal minimums of 1,614,000 acres and 1,596,000 short tons, respectively.

Proposals on loan rates and program operating

provisions will be issued later. Written comments should be sent to the Director, Price Support and Loan Division, USDA-ASCS, Room 3741, South Building, P. O. Box 2415, Washington, D. C. 20013. Comments will be available for public inspection during normal business hours in the Office of the Director.

PSAT Schedule Is Released

Harold Nichols, counselor at Holmes High School has announced that juniors will be able to join over 1-million other students around the world in taking the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test-National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT-NMSQT) this fall. The test, cosponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation, is an important step in making college plans.

Scheduled for Saturday at Holmes High School, the PSAT-NMSQT measures verbal and mathematical aptitude — two abilities important in doing college work — and gives students a chance to find out what the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) is like.

By taking the PSAT-NMSQT, students can enter the competition for scholarships administered by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation and ask to participate in the College Board's Student Search Service, which gives students an opportunity to hear from colleges that they might not otherwise know about.

With their score reports, students receive a copy of About Your PSAT-NMSQT Scores, a booklet that contains valuable how-to information about estimating SAT scores, finding out where to get and how to use detailed in-

formation about colleges and financial aid, and planning for financing a college education.

In addition, students can use the College Board's

"The College Handbook, 1979-80" to compare their

scores with those of enrolled students at more than 2,400 colleges and universities.


