## Watercolor Techniques To Be Taught

The Chowan Arts Council is again offering a four-day watercolor techniques workshop to be taught by Outer Banks artists Stephen M. Andrus.

Those interested may register for either a day or

an evening session. Each workshop will meet for four days, January 17, 18 and 21, 22. Each session will last 3½ hours, and will be held at the Chowan Arts Council building on West Water Street.

The weekend break in the middle of the workshop is designed to give students an opportunity to become familiar with techniques and materials.

The fee for the workshop is \$45.00 which includes a few supplies. Any supplies needed which the student may not have can be purchased from the artist during classes.

"The first Andrus workshops, held in 1976 in Edenton, were well attended and the Arts Council has heard many requests from local enthusiasts to arrange for the artist's return," spokesman Carol Sick stated.

"Andrus, a true 'working artist' who produces some 400 paintings per year, seems to have the unique ability to give useful instruction to the novice watercolorist and the experienced hobbyist alike," she commented.

"There is something in his classes for all levels of experience" say many of those who attended his 1976 workshops.

Beginners report being given unusually good boost into the medium and those who have done watercolors for years are pleased to find they are able to refine their work with the artist's special techniques.

All agree, finally, that Andrus is as entertaining as he is instructive.

Andrus work has become known throughout the East in the last decade, and his

paintings have been sold throughout the U.S., Europe, and South America.

A graduate of the University of Iowa, Andrus holds a degree in Art Education and received his Master of Fine Arts degree from the Instituto Allende, Mexico. He taught art many years on the high school and college levels, and in 1976 retired from formal teaching to open a gallery and studio on the Outer Banks.

Andrus paintings portray familiar scenes along the East Coast, and he has found an abundance of

marine subject matter in coastal Carolina.

Though a showing of his work is not being planned prior to his workshops, a collection of his paintings may be seen at Queen Anne Sails, Edenton Marina, during weekday business hours. A larger exhibit is displayed at Andrus Gallery and Studio at Whalebone Junction.

## Around The Farms

We will have our annual peanut production meeting at the American Legion Building on Thursday, January 24, at 2 P.M. We have a new variety, NC-7, that will be discussed along with other production practices that are either different than they have been in the past or new.

At the present time our average yield on peanut production for 1979 is around 2,900 pounds per acre, which means that someone in Chowan County had real good yields. We had a lot of problems getting our peanuts in in 1979 due to the weather and this we hope

will not be a real problem in 1980.

I do believe that we let peanuts nature better in 1979 than we have ever done before. This probably had much to do with our grade and yield.

Other meetings that will be coming up are: Corn and Soybean Meeting - January 29, 2 P.M. Municipal Building. Cyst nematodes in soybeans costs us a lot of money. We will discuss prevention of cyst, fertility of corn, methods of fertilization, costs, and varieties.

Vegetable Production Meeting: January 31, 7:30 P.M., Oak Grove Community Building.
