In the last 28 years, Mr. Cree has been engaged in various aspects of the Indian ministry. For several

Mr. Cree spent 12 years in the Southwest on the Papago Reservation in southern Arizona. He was instrumental in the building of a sanctuary at Sells. In addition, young people from that congregation responded to train for the Gospel ministry. In these efforts the indigenous principles have been applied that have resulted in a strong local leadership and financial independence.

Mrs. Hollowell read a poem of love for the husbands present and every one joined in singing "Let Me Call You Sweetheart".

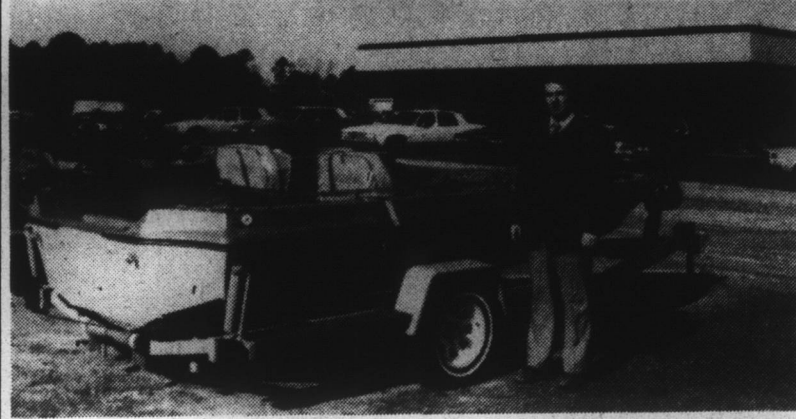
Bus Driver Training Set
