Power Resolution Filed In Senate

Sen. Melvin R. Daniels, Jr., D-Pasquotank and Sen. J. J. "Monk" Harrington, D-Bertie, today filed Senate Joint Resolution No. 693 calling on the General Assembly of North Carolina to utilize its resources to fully review and assess the concerns of the citizens of Northeastern North Carolina for economic, adequate, and reliable electric power for the northeastern counties of North Carolina. The resolution states that the Legislative Utility Review Committee shall prepare and present its findings along with recommendations for legislation to the 1983 session of the General Assembly.

Senator Daniels stated that along with looking at the efficiency of the present provider, Virginia Electric and Power Company, he would also encourage the Utility Review Committee to monitor closely the progress of the peat generating capabilities. A companion bill is being introduced in the House by Representative John Gilliam of Bertie County and Representative Bill Harrison of Martin County.
