Views On Dental Health

HOW TO REDUCE SWELLING

There are two kinds of swelling associated with dental problems (trauma and infection) and they are treated in different ways. So, first you should determine the cause.

Usually you'll know if it is the result of a trauma, such as a baseball bat to the jaw or a dental procedure like a tooth extraction. Swelling from an infection is usually preceded by pain and may cause an overall sick feeling, with fever and perspiration. In either case, you should see the dentist as soon as possible. Alleviating the swelling doesn't cure the cause.

For swelling caused by injury or dental procedure, the treatment

is ice. An ice pack should be applied for a minimum of half hour on and half hour off.

For swelling caused by an infection, heat is applied. A heating pad, hot water bottle or hot towel applied to the face will dilate (enlarge) the blood vessels and enable more of the infection-fighting elements of the blood (or antibiotics, if they have been prescribed) to come to the infected area.
