RALEIGH — Gov. Jim Hunt has announced that UNC President William C. Friday will head a commission focusing on North Carolina's next two decades. Friday will serve as chairman of the Commission on the Future

thinking." The commission is composed of state leaders in education, business, law, medicine, the environment and other fields; members of the North Carolina General Assembly; and members of the State Goals and Policy Board, the state's chief citizen advisory body.

In making the announcements, Governor Hunt noted some of the major projections for the next 19 years:

Whale Study Cruise Is Set For Oct. 17

Are you looking for something different to do on an October weekend? Then sign up for an exciting Whale Study Cruise on October 17.

The Whale Watch is sponsored by the North Carolina Marine Resources Center-Roanoke Island, and the N. C. Marine Education and Resources Foundation. Participants will board the head boat "Crystal Dawn" captained by Alan Foreman. The modern ocean-going vessel can carry a maximum of 60 persons on the cruise.

Leaders for the cruise will be Charlie Potter, a marine mammal specialist with the Smithsonian Institute; David Lee of the N. C. Museum of Natural History, a bird specialist; and Ron Naveen with National Marine Fisheries. Also aboard will be Hilda Livingstone, education coordinator of the Marine Resources Center.

Participants will receive help in identifying navigational aids, vessels, birds, fish, flotsom, and whales.

At a cost of \$25 per person, participants will sail from the Pirates Cove Marina on the Nags Head Causeway at 5:30 A. M. October 17. The boat will return at 6 P. M.

Participants should bring their own food, warm clothing, binoculars, and sea sick pills.

Through a project called North Carolina 2000, the commission will build public awareness of the choices and will involve citizens in identifying what they want for their future. The final product will be a set of recommended actions.

The first meeting of the Commission on the Future is scheduled for Thursday, October 22 at the Hilton Inn here.
