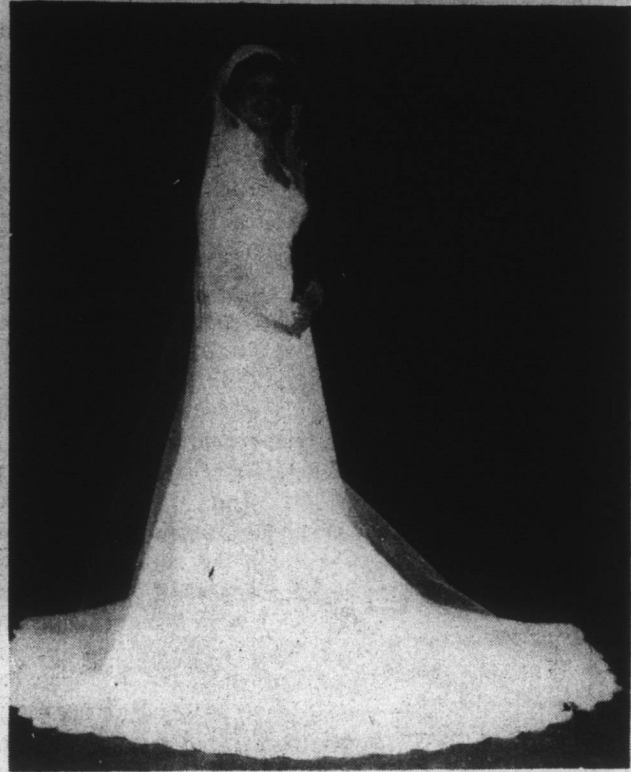

The Fractured Tooth

Every year thousands of people have accidents that cause damage to face and mouth, sometimes resulting in a fractured tooth. It may be caused by an auto accident or sports or an accidental fall at the home. Whatever the cause, a fractured tooth presents a serious problem and should be treated immediately to prevent infection and loss of the tooth.

If the fracture hasn't penetrated to the pulp of the tooth, the dentist will apply medication to ease the pain and place a temporary cap over the tooth to protect it. Later the tooth will be crowned

to restore its appearance. If the pulp has been exposed by the fracture, the tooth must be treated within 24 hours to prevent infection and other complications. Any pulp that becomes infected will have to be removed to save the tooth. This is commonly known as a root canal.

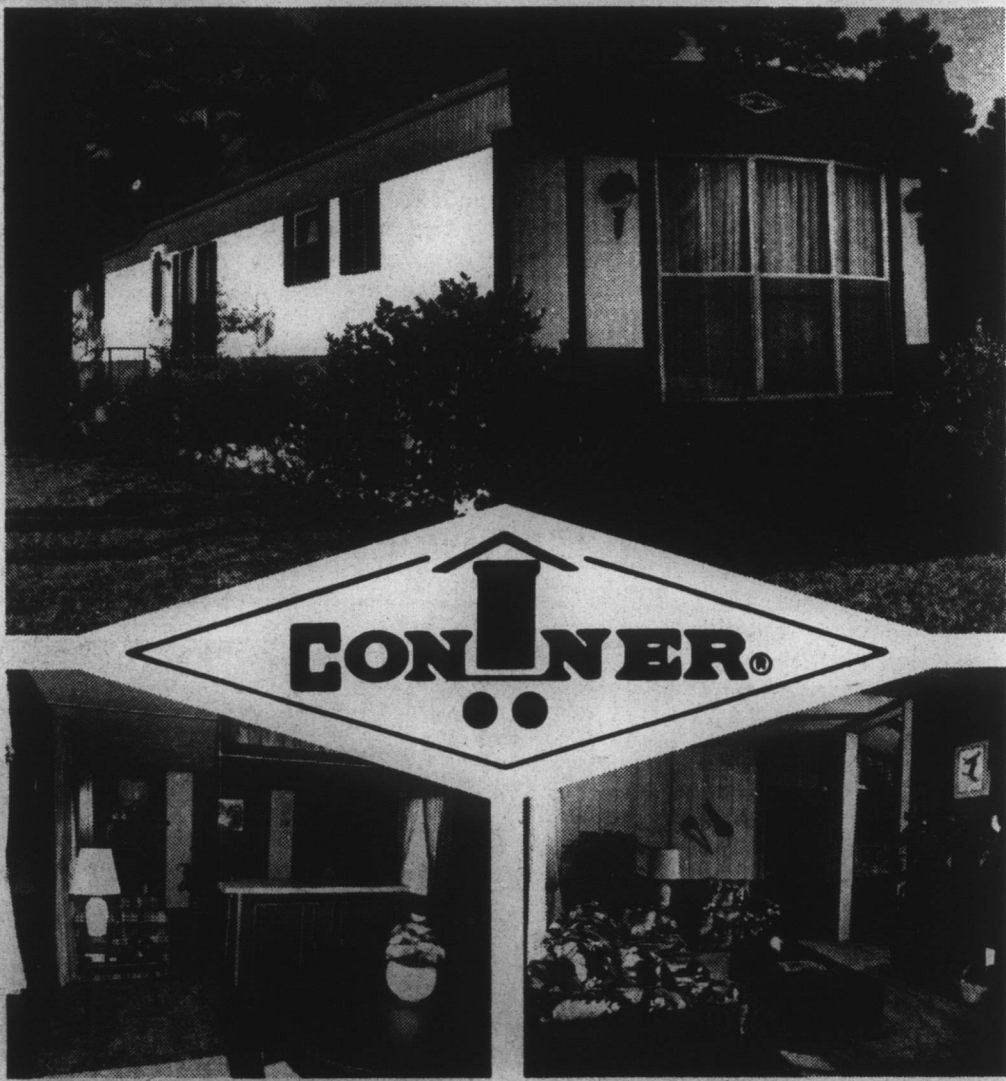
Whatever the cause, there should be no delay in seeking treatment when a tooth is fractured.

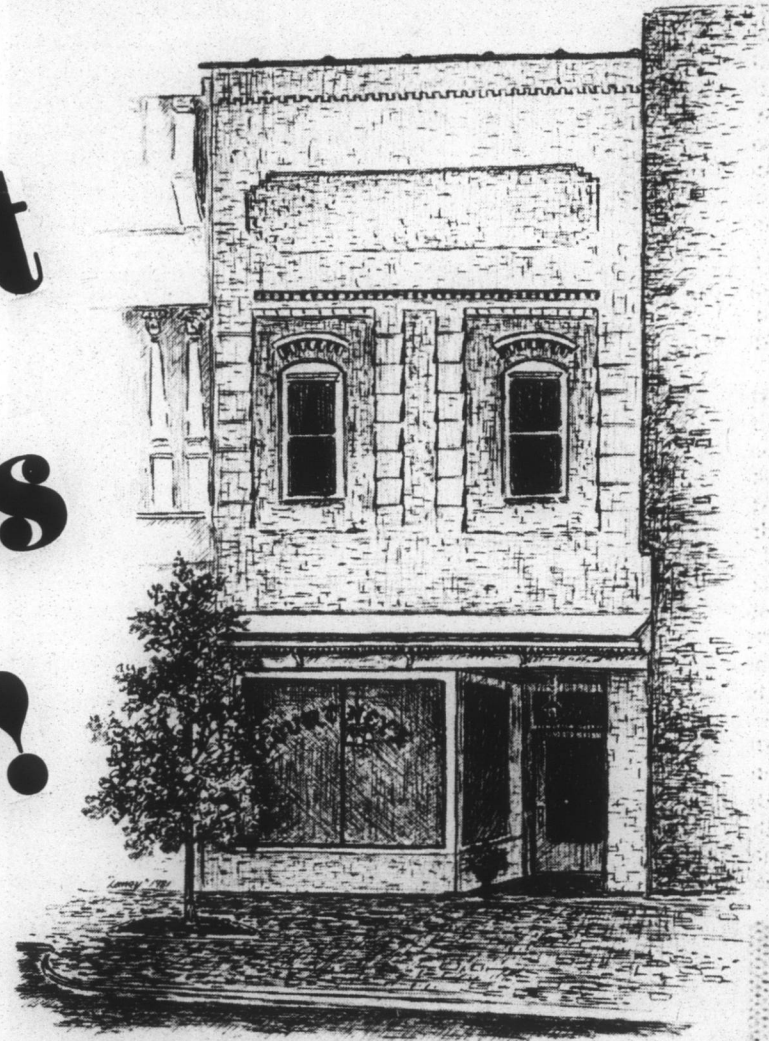
