Britannica Micropedia, American Heritage Dictionary.

The two teams with the highest score will compete in the statewide competition to be held in Durham on April 24. They are: Bertie County Senior High School in Windsor, first place; and Northeastern High School in Elizabeth City, second place.

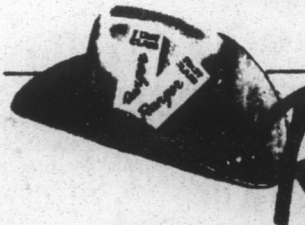
