He added that the \$120 million of additional revenue generated by the Governor's "Good Roads" program has been used chiefly for maintenance to protect the highway system as originally proposed. This past fiscal year, the Board awarded contracts to resurface 3,300 miles of highways as compared to approximately 350 miles the

Roberson cautioned that unless new sources of funds are found by July, 1983, the state will not have matching funds for federal highway aid used in the highway improvement program. Currently 1977 bond funds

These funds will be exhausted by July of next year. That will mean, in effect, said Roberson, that "we won't have a highway construction program after that date!"
