CommUnique Offer Local Television Facilities

Williamston, Edenton and Hertford are the first of several northeastern North Carolina towns to get local television facilities. CommUnique Corp. of Edenton, and soon of Windsor, will install video tape playback equipment at local cable TV

headends which will make local programming a reality by way of the local CATV systems. General Manager of CommUnique, John R. Smith, says he expects the facilities to be operational before Christmas. Meanwhile, the company has purchased an

existing building at 310 Granville street in Windsor and is modifying it to include a professional production studio. Video equipment including cameras, editors, recorders switchers, etc. will be installed at the location for post-production, in addition to cen-

tral offices and management. Other towns to receive this new service in the near future include Plymouth and Windsor. Smith said that it is reasonable to speculate that the cable systems in Windsor and Plymouth may be updated soon and that the local video service will probably go "on line" at that time or possibly before.

Presently, CommUnique is operational with the "People Channels" on Channel 10 in Williamston and Channel 6 in Edenton and Hertford. Public

service announcements from non-profit organizations are being solicited for free airing in both locations. Additional to this service and that of local programming, CommUnique will have the capability to insert advertising locally on ESPN and USA satellite networks.
