"You have to have an untold amount of patience," explained Elizabeth Wilson, one of Lewis' patients from Chapel Hill. "I feel like a child just learning how to pro-nounce words, but at least now I can look up telephone numbers and read letters and the bank statement."

Low vision has been around as a medical specialty for 20 years, but the clinic at N.C. Memorial is the first for a hospital in the state. Lewis, an optometrist, has held his faculty position in the School of Medicine's department of ophthalmology for three

"Newer surgical techniques are preserving vision in eyes that are not too long ago would have been lost," Lewis explained. "These patients, however, are often left with markedly reduced vision, which prevents them from performing tasks that the normally seeing person takes for

"Although reduced vision is not as disabling to patients as blindness, it must be dealt with if these people are to have a chance to be useful, productive human beings. Senior citizens may become much less a burden on society if they are able to be inependent, while in children, a successful education may depend upon access to low vision optical assistance."
