

### **Drifting Teeth**

After you've had a tooth extracted, you may think your other teeth will stay right where they are, but that's not likely to happen. As soon as a gap is created in your mouth, the outer teeth are prone to drifting, especially the teeth closest to the gap. This can cause serious dental probelms, including eventual loss of

When you have a missing tooth, there is a natural tendency for the teeth on either side of the gap to drift toward each other. This may happen so slowly and imperceptively that you don't realize it's happening at first. With the drifting, open contact areas are, created where food will

collect, causing tooth

decay. This can cause gum infection and bone

loss problems. The drifting also throws your other teeth out of alignment, resulting in malocclusion or improper bite. This will decrease your chewing efficiency and put abnormal strain on your remaining teeth. Sometimes this results in jaw pain. If you have a missing tooth, you should ask your dentist what he would recommend to replace it.
