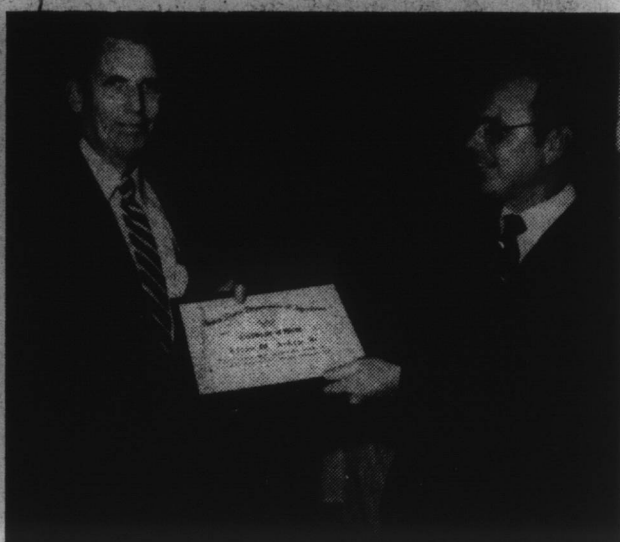

### Edmisten Gets Restraining Order

Attorney General Rufus L. Edmisten January 25, was granted a temporary restraining order against United States Testing Authority, Inc., a Florida-based firm accused in a state lawsuit of breaching a November agreement to settle North Carolina complaints about its mass-mailed television "test response" survey alleged to violate state contest laws.

"I've run out of patience with these folks," Edmisten said about the Bay Village, Florida firm's failure to honor an out-of-court settlement agreement in which U.S. Testing promised to make written offers of full refunds to all North Carolinians who paid "shipping and handling costs" for "free" gifts.

The state's suit alleges that U.S. Testing failed to send the letters offering refunds to consumers and failed to comply with other terms of the agreement.

"We negotiated with them in good faith, but they have demonstrated bad faith by almost totally ignoring their responsibilities," Edmisten said.

The firm's "test response" questionnaires about personal television viewing preferences with instructions to send \$14.80 to cover shipping and handling costs on a

Crime Control and Public Safety Secretary Heman R. Clark said, "Since 1916, the first year records were kept, 79 people have been killed by tornadoes in North Carolina. One died last year."

"Participation in the planned drill will only take a few minutes and will give everyone who participates a good understanding of whether they are prepared to deal with a tornado. Practicing now may mean saving a life if people ever face a real tornado," Clark said.

North Carolina citizens are urged to take part in the drill. Citizens desiring more information about it should contact the local Emergency Management Agency.

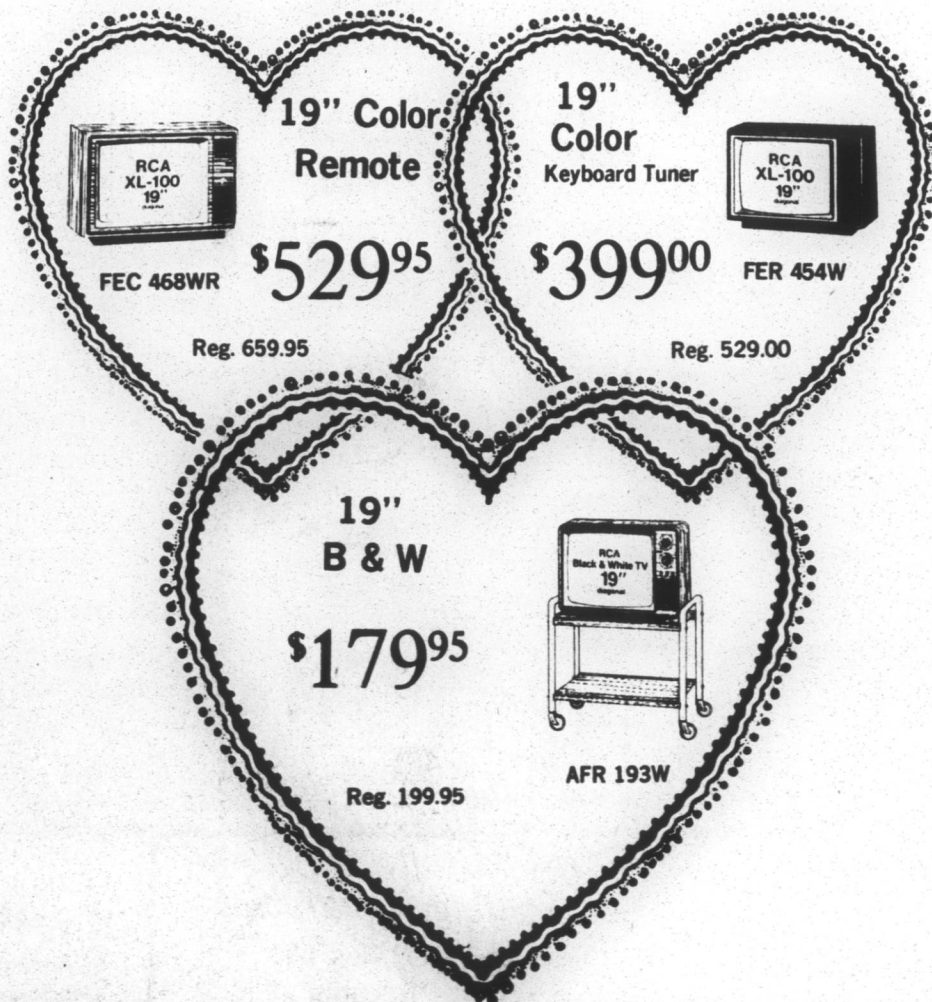

## Letter To The Editor

This is an invitation for you to join other North Carolinians in a movement to make every vehicle pay its fair share to repair and maintain North Carolina's roads and highways.

Even though the Congress recently passed an additional five-cents-a-gallon gasoline tax, and although North Carolina passed a three-cents-a-gallon tax in 1981, it is likely that our General Assembly will consider still another tax on gasoline.

Big money is at stake. North Carolina must have additional revenues if it is to maintain our 56,000 miles of roads and if we are to share in massive Federal funding projects.

North Carolina must raise from \$40- to \$60-million in matching funds to claim from \$160 to \$265 million from Federal gas tax funds for roads.

But rather than another North Carolina tax on gasoline, we, the N.C. Road Savers Council, advocate a fair share highways users arrangement.

This would raise some \$80-million annually, and much of it come from out-of-state sources.

This would permit us to qualify for Federal road funds. It would help us protect our great investment in good roads programs and help us protect jobs—in agriculture and industry and related areas—that depend on good roads.

And we urge you to get in touch, as soon as possible, with your legislators. Please express to them your interest in

establishing a fair share program to repair and maintain our highways.

By making every vehicle pay its fair share, we can help pave the road ahead for all our citizens for years to come.
