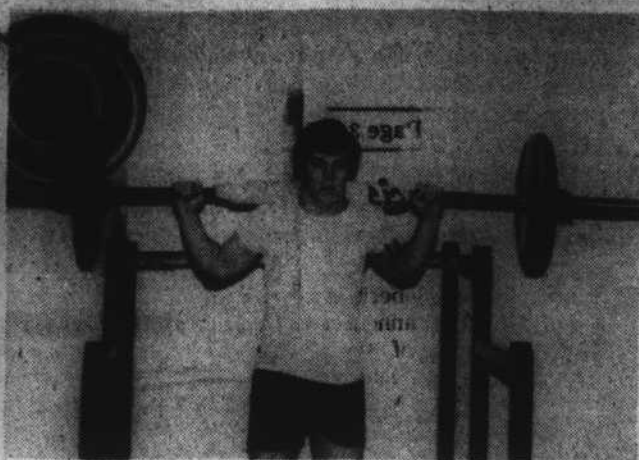

Don Alred, local revenue officer for the North Carolina Department of Revenue, advises that personnel to assist in filing State income and intangibles tax returns will be available on Tuesday of each week through April 16. The office is located at Room 201, NCNB Bank Building, Edenton and assistance is available on this day between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.

Alred requests that taxpayers bring the pre-addressed forms which were mailed to them from Raleigh.

Taxpayers filing their own returns should mail those which indicate a refund to the North Carolina Department of Revenue, Post Office Box R, Raleigh, North Carolina 27634; other completed returns should be mailed to the North Carolina Department of Revenue, Post Office Box 25000, Raleigh, North Carolina 27640.

**Vision And Safe Driving**
