Roller Skate Night

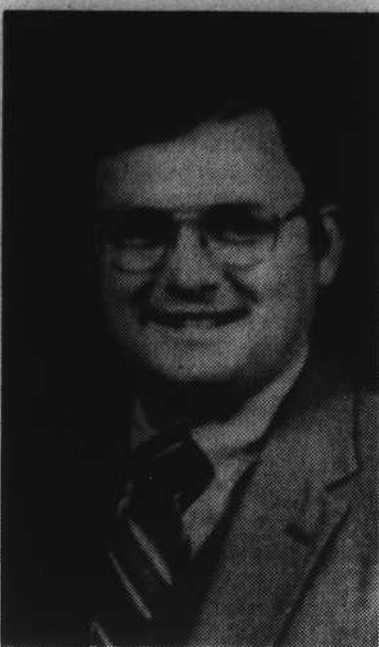

In preparation for the second Chowan County 4-H Flower Growing Contest, forty-one 4-Hers and leaders toured Paradise Gardens and Green Leaf Farm on April 23. At Paradise Gardens we saw trees, shrubs, bedding plants, vegetable plants, and hanging baskets.

We had a real nice and knowledgeable, as well as attractive, young guide, Casey Bass. She showed a wide understanding of the large operation and was patient in answering questions. These good things qualified her to be labeled as a good guide.

At Paradise Gardens, Murray Goodwin, 4-H coordinator, discussed the 1985 flower growing contest. He gave the rules and regulations of the contest which state you cannot have more than 24 flowers to start with, the flowers must be grown where 4-Her lives, and you must be a 4-Her. This is easy since nearly all clubs would be delighted to have new members.

Suggestions for growing flowers were passed out and discussed. The only change from last year's

sheet was about lime and fertilizer. It was just made a little simpler. When we get the names of participating 4-Hers we will send a copy of project book.

Real Estate Investing
(Get Rich Quick?)

You've probably seen the dozens of books and seminars with variations on the title **How To Make A Million Dollars In Real Estate**. Could you really get rich quick by investing in real estate? Investing in real estate takes knowledge, time, energy - and a bit of luck. If you have those things and some perseverance, investing in real estate won't make you rich quick, but as one writer said, it might make you rich slowly.

Investing in residential rental property is probably the most attractive real estate investment for individuals. Your return will include the rents you receive, the tax writeoffs you get, and any appreciation in the property over a period of time.

If you decide to buy rental property for an investment, here are some suggestions:

1. Buy property where you live rather than in some other part of the country. You can manage your property more easily and will probably have a better feel for property values.
2. Look for a bargain. Find a piece of property that needs only cosmetic repair to appreciate in value. Don't buy property needing major repairs such as new wiring, plumbing, or structural renovating.
3. Select property where the rents will cover the mortgage payments, taxes, insurance and other costs. You don't need a tax writeoff that drains cash out of your pocket, no matter what your tax bracket.
4. Invest only if you have the financial resources to stay with the investment if there is a downturn. If real estate values decline temporarily or if you have a series of vacancies, you should be able to stay with the investment until the situation improves.
5. Sell at the right time. Experience and perhaps a little professional assistance will help you decide when to sell. Take your profits and reinvest them in an even larger piece of rental property.

From The Veterans Administration

(Editor's Note: Following are representative questions answered daily by VA Counselors. Full information is available at any VA office.)

Q — May a veteran who receives a monthly check for service-connected disabilities be granted an additional allowance for dependents?

A — Veterans whose service-connected disabilities are rated at 30% or more are entitled to an additional allowance for dependents.

Q — I attend college under the GI Bill. I am married, but separated from my wife. Can she get part of my educational assistance allowance without my consent?

A — Yes, if your wife can prove that you are not providing for your family she can request the portion

paid you for your dependents and you will receive the rate of a single veteran.

Q — What are the eligibility requirements for the Veterans Administration Vocational Rehabilitation and Counseling program?

A — A veteran must have served during World War II or thereafter, be entitled to receive compensation for a service-connected disability and have been discharged, released or retired from service under other than dishonorable conditions. In addition, the VA must determine that the veteran is in need of vocational rehabilitation to overcome an employment handicap caused by the service-connected disability and that the veteran's period of eligibility has not expired.

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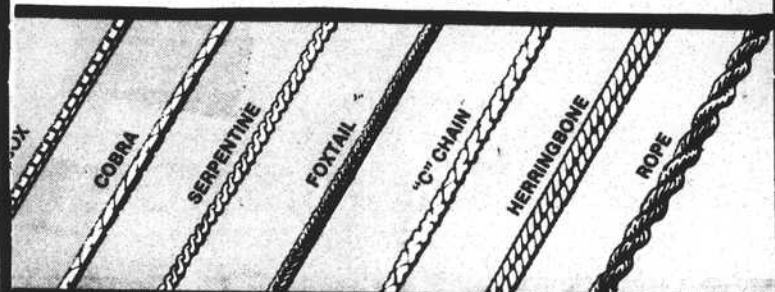
