Many Killed While Not Wearing Seat Belts

Nearly 300 people not wearing seat belts died in automobile accidents in North Carolina during the first four months of this year according to N.C. Division of Motor Vehicle reports.

Mrs. Dan K. Moore, chairman of Seat Belts for Safety, said, "The unnecessary loss of so many North Carolinians in such a short period is a recurring tragedy our state can longer ignore."

Seat Belts for Safety compiled the statistics based on DMV accident reports. The organization is a coalition of over a dozen statewide organizations, with thousands of members supporting the passage of a state law requiring the use of seat belts.

The bill passed the Senate 30-20. It is being considered by the

House Highway Safety Committee.

The accident reports indicated from January 1-April 30, 270 persons not wearing seat belts were killed, or more than two per day. Based on previous years, an estimated 2,500 persons not wearing seat belts were seriously injured during the same period.

The majority of victims were under 40. Many persons not wearing seat belts were killed after being thrown from their vehicles.

Experts from the UNC Highway Research Center have estimated that two out of every three people killed in automobile accidents would have been saved if they had worn seat belts.

Last year approximately 1,000 people died in automobile ac-

cidents in North Carolina. Another 10,000 were seriously injured.

"These fatal accidents leave parents without children, or children without parents. Behind the statistics are high school students who had their whole lives ahead of them, young people on their way up, community leaders, friends and relatives," Mrs. Moore said. "Few would have believed it could ever happen to them."

Clark Speaker Heart Assembly

CHAPEL HILL—Mrs. Clark, wife of Dr. Barney Clark, the world's first recipient of a permanent artificial heart, will be a featured speaker at the 36th Annual Meeting Delegate Assembly and Scientific Sessions of the American Heart Association, North Carolina Affiliate. The annual meeting will be held at the Marriott Hotel in Raleigh, May 17-18.

Mrs. Clark is the national Campaign chairperson for the American Heart Association, and has spoken all across the country about the events leading up to her husband's decision to become the first recipient of the permanent artificial heart. Clark suffered from a degenerative disease of the heart muscle that causes it to lose the resiliency necessary to sufficiently pump blood throughout the body. He lived 112 days with the artificial heart, before other health complications ended his life.

In addition to Mrs. Clark's presentation, special sessions will be held for doctors, nurses and other allied medical professionals, concerning other medical breakthroughs, such as angioplasty, a preventive surgical technique for heart attack patients, and heart transplants. Training sessions for the Affiliate's medical and non-medical volunteers will also be held.
