1. Wear a bright costume that can be seen by drivers and fellow trick or treaters. If you are wearing a dark costume, paste some shiny, reflective tape to your clothes.

2. Don't walk on the street, stick to the sidewalk. When you do have to cross the street, make sure you look in all directions.

"Children are most susceptible to head injuries because they are more active and less coordinated than adults," says Dr. Carol Luzzi, director of Medico's Pediatric Rehabilitation Services at Visitors Hospital in Buchanan, Michigan.
