The conference also included four other topics on Wednesday, September 23, including writing for advertising, writing for news releases and features, creative public relations writing and writing for slide, videotape and radio presentations. Other presenters include Robert Bodle, creative director, Behrends, Bodle and Parsons Advertising, Inc. of Greensboro; Val Lauder, instructor, School of Journalism, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; Myra Joines, public information coordinator, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools; and a faculty member of the Department of English, N.C. State University.

The N.C. School Public Relations Association Inc. is a statewide organization of public information and community schools professionals, in addition to other members of public schools and higher education organizations.

Monday: Breakfast - orange juice, assorted cereals, milk. Lunch - cheeseburger-bun, french fries, hotchup, fresh apples, milk.

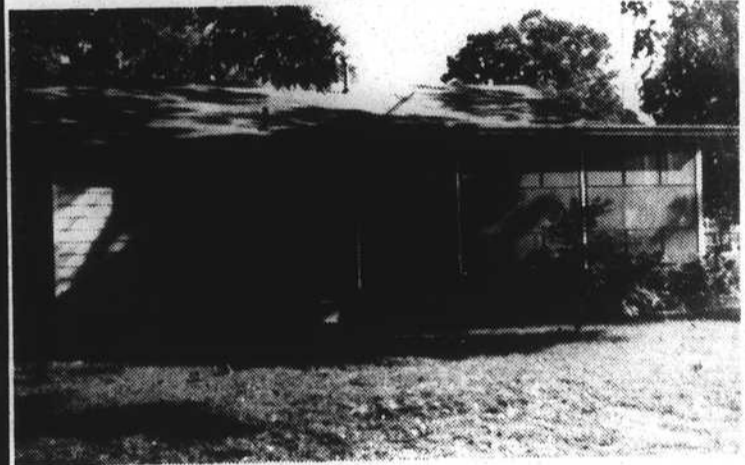
