The hybrids come in four sizes from dwarfs to 35-foot trees. They have tolerance to cold weather, some withstanding temperatures below zero degrees. The bitter winter of '84-85 destroyed thousands of crepe myrtles in North Carolina.

About 45,000 plants have been made available to wholesale nurseries in 18 states.

Names to look for include Biloxi, Miami and Wichita. These are about the same size as the traditional crepe myrtles. Natchez, Muskogee and Tuscarora are the first mildew resistant varieties to reach retail sales outlets. Some of the other new varieties are Tuskegee, Acoma, Hopi, Pecos and Zuni.

puter simulation that have occurred.

Course content ranges from recognizing myocardial infarction - heart attack - to the treatment thereof, utilizing electrical shock, invasive monitoring techniques, and medications. While direct management of the cardiac emergency lies with the physician, it is the nurses who make up the supporting team. By meeting certification requirements in ACLS, Chowan Hospital's registered nurses have the knowledge and practical base to provide quality care to victims of cardiac arrest.

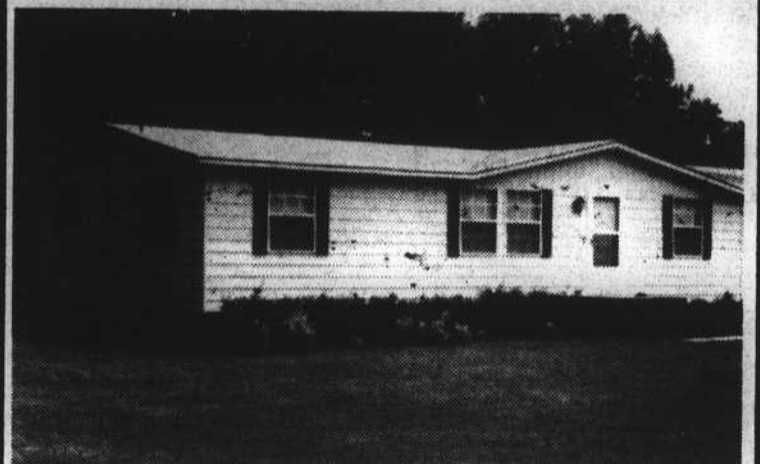
Dear Editor:
