## Consultant Addresses Kiwanis Club

Hearing, or the possible deterioration of same, was the subject of Wednesday's Kiwanis Club speaker.

Charles Evans, occupational hearing consultant, servicing the Federally mandated "OSHA" hearing and conservation program, spoke on the several requirements and penalties for non-compliance with the government noise guidelines developed for industry in 1981. These guidelines became law in 1983.

Evans, owner of the Industrial Sound and Hearing Service, based in Edenton, utilizes his soundproofed auto-van to provide mobile expertise in

seven states. Approximately 58,000 miles are traveled per year.

The program encompasses a five point field from monitoring to record-keeping.

An employee, whose testing results in a ten point reduction from his "base line," will have his personnel file documented.

Those companies failing to comply with the program, where indicated, may be fined 15 thousand dollars upon first offense. Subsequent offenses may result in closing of that facility.

Examples of the 85 decibel rating can be compared with the normal talking voice area of 82 db. The Edenton fire siren, at street level, is 100 db. Since readings are weighed over 2-4-6-8 hour periods, excessive intermittent short periods are permitted in the calculations.

A simplified test for hearing loss is the difference in apparent comfortable volume settings in your car radio between your returning home at day's end and going to work the following morning. It will normally sound too loud the next day.

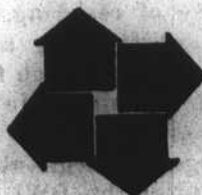
