Cummings To Instruct Radio Theatre Workshop

The Chowan Arts Council and the Edenton-Chowan Parks and Recreation Department are co-sponsoring a radio theater workshop this summer, open to all children in grades K-12.

The three-week program will run from July 7 through August 3, Mondays through Thursdays. K-6 students will meet from 9:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. and students in grades 7-12 will meet from 7 p.m. until 9 p.m.

Jim Cummings, a Norfolk resident and theater enthusiast, will instruct the course.

Cummings, 23, has a rich theater background. After finishing high school in Richmond, Va., he attended the American Musical and Dramatics Academy (AMDA) in New York City for two years. AMDA accepts only 16 new students a semester from the various auditions that are held all over the country. Jim was not only accepted, but won a scholarship as well.

He has also participated in several Old Dominion University one-act plays as actor and director. In 1987, Jim organized an ODU student radio theater show that was aired over the campus radio. A group of interested students got together every week to come up with material that would be suitable for the program's format.

"The show was mostly on the humorous side," Cummings said. "We had outrageous commercials, soap opwhatever else the group came up with. We had a good show.
