is North America's 29th largest independent tire dealer. based on an annual ranking of tire dealerships in the United States and Canada by Tire Business, a bi-weekly newspaper covering the tire distribution business throughout North

The ranking is based on the number of dealer-owned and operated outlets. The 1998 list is the 15th annual ranking the newspaper has published, and at 75 dealerships, the largest list ever compiled. The 75 companies listed operate more than 5,300 outlets, and account for more than \$4.5 billion in sales of tires, wheels and automotive service. The average dealership operates 72 stores and reports more than \$80 million in annual retail sales.

The size of the dealers singled out in this study reflects the changing face of the primarily local, hometown businesses, independently owned tire dealerships are growing into major enterprises with hundreds of outlets, thousands of employees and hundreds of millions of dollars in sales.

All told, it's estimated there are more than 39,000 retail outlets across the U.S. selling tires. Independent tire dealerships as opposed to tire companyowned stores, mass merchandisers or wholesale clubs - account for approximately 55-60 percent of all retail passenger car and light truck tire sales and therefore represent the single largest channel of distribution.


The George C. Moore Company in Edenton recently held its annual banquet to honor employees with 25 or more years of continuous service.







