Perquimans rallies to drop Edenton

But that's exactly what Perquimans County did Friday night by storming back from an 11-point deficit to overtake Northeastern-Albemarle Conference rival Edenton Holmes,

The night didn't start out so well for Perquimans though. The visiting Aces broke out their showtime offense and ran the Pirates off the floor to the tune of a 40-31 halftime lead.


