

# Boyle to lead discussion group

Tuesdays with Morrie will be the topic of the Friends' book discussion group, which meets on the third Thursday of each month (May 20) at 3:30 p.m. Debbie Boyle will lead a discussion of the best-selling memoir of a man who devotes Tuesday afternoons to a favorite professor who is now in the last days of his life.

East of the Mountains by David Guterson tells of a widowed doctor with terminal cancer who sets off on one last hunting trip into his beloved mountains, a trip from which he does not plan to return. What he experiences along the way, both from his own thoughts and from encounters with other people stirs a profound change within him. Author Guterson's other novel, Snow Falling on Cedars is now being made into a film.

In another "Ivy League Mystery" by Pamela Thomas-Graham, Yale is the scene of the crime. A black football player is suspected of killing a professor and New Haven becomes divided along racial lines in Blue Blood.

From Mary Higgins Clark: We'll Meet Again. A woman, who has served time for the murder of her husband, begins

a search for the true murderer upon her release from prison. Set in upscale Greenwich, Connecticut, the investigation leads to a complex case of embezzlement, HMO fraud and personal vendettas.

Christian fiction from Janette Oake and T. Davis Bunn: The Meeting Place is set in Acadia in 1753 where French settlers and British settlers live parallel lives, always viewing the other with suspicion and fear. Then in a chance encounter, differences are shed and a friendship is forged.

Dr. Caitlin Taylor wants to reunite estranged twins, one capable of saving the other's life, in Thief of Hearts, a medical drama and romance. Author Katherine Stone, who now

writes full-time, was formerly a practicing physician.

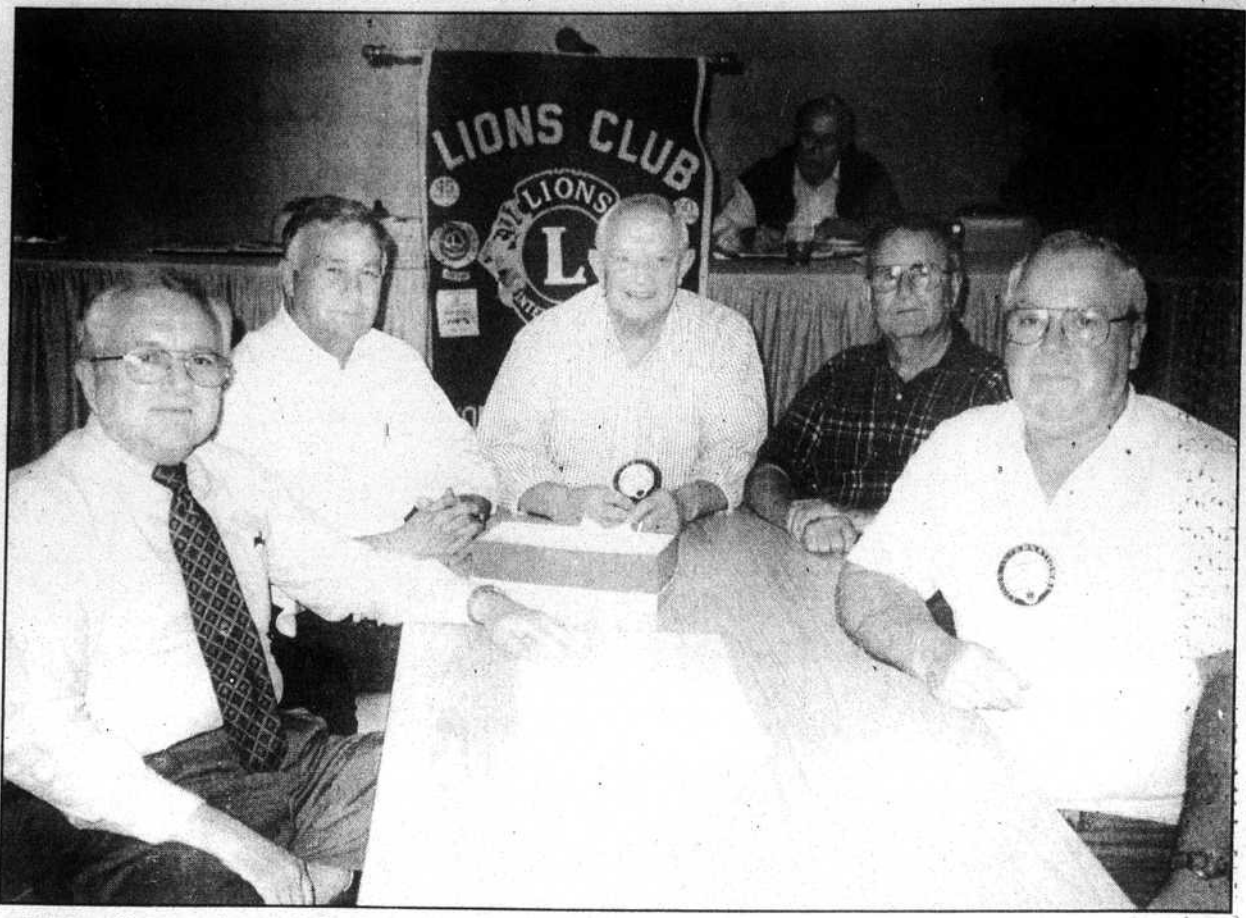
Bone by Bone by Peter Mattiessen is the concluding book in the author's trilogy set in the Florida Everglades. This final book is told in the voice of Mr. Watson - whose controversial and violent life began the series - beginning with Reconstruction days and ending with his death just before World War I.

Intimacy by Hanif Kureishi is a powerful novella that reveals a man's thoughts as he prepares to leave the woman with whom he has spent the last six years. His guilt and sorrow are overwhelmed by his desire to move on in search of fresh experiences.

Sisters are living a structured existence until two fairly quirky and unconventional relationships develop and change the patterns of their lives in Falling Slowly by Anita Brookner.

Project Girl by Janet McDonald is the true story of a black woman who grew up in the New York City housing projects. In stark contrast to her neighborhood, she earned degrees from Vassar, Columbia, and New York University and now practices law in Paris. Her life is even more amazing, though, because she had more than her share of problems. She brought most of these problems on herself, but somehow
