East of the Mountains by David Guterson tells of a widowed doctor with terminal cancer who sets off on one last hunting trip into his beloved mountains, a trip from which he does not plan to return. What he experiences along the way, both from his own thoughts and from encounters with other people stirs a profound change within him. Author Guterson's other novel. Snow Falling on Cedars is now being made into a film.

In another "Ivy League Mystery" by Pamela Thomas-Graham, Yale is the scene of the crime. A black football player is suspected of killing a professor and New Haven becomes divided along racial lines in Blue Blood.


From Mary Higgins Clark: We'll Meet Again. A woman, who has served time for the murder of her husband, begins thor Katherine Stone, who now

Intimacy by Hanif Kureishi is a powerful novella that reveals a man's thoughts as he prepares to leave the woman with whom he has spent the last six years. His guilt and sorrow are overwhelmed by his desire to move on in search of fresh experiences.

Sisters are living a structured existence until two fairly quirky and unconventional relationships develop and change the patterns of their lives in Falling Slowly by Anita Brookner.

Project Girl by Janet Mc-Donald is the true story of a black woman who grew up in the New York City housing projects. In stark contrast to her neighborhood, she earned degrees from Vassar, Columbia, and New York University and now practices law in Paris. Her life is even more amazing, though, because she had more than her share of problems. She brought most of these problems on herself, but somehow


