Two compact books from Europe: A best seller overseas, The Pollen Room by Swiss-born Zoe Jenny, is a contemporary coming-of-age book, a starkly realistic and disturbing story. Trumpet by Jackie Kay revisits the life of a jazz trumpeter whose death unleashes a carefully guarded family secret. That secret, revealed at death radically alters accepted beliefs and traditions among family and acquaintances.

A wonderful poster from the 1920's says, "Women bring all Voters" into the world-Let Women Vote. "


