

armed conflict. France, seeking to extend her holdings on the African continent, wages war on the Tuareg inhabitants who block the building of a Saharan railroad.

and become part of the denouement of the trilogy.


Esther Williams was The Million Dollar Mermaid. She writes candidly about Hollywood and her life and her loves in this biography.

Not for Ourselves Alone: The Story of Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony is the name of an upcoming PBS documentary. Geoffrey C. Ward and Ken Burns have also collaborated on a companion volume to the film. The two women, different in so many ways, formed a bond that lasted their lifetimes as they relentlessly pursued the cause of women's rights.

Night Fall Fast: Understanding Suicide by Kay Redfield Jamison. The author is a Professor of Psychiatry at Johns Hopkins and she has struggled with manic-depression herself. In addition to revealing the multitude of situations that can lead to suicide attempts, she suggests new drug treatments that are being used successfully.

William Least Heat-Moon adds another descriptive travel volume to his credits, this time plying America's waters in his boat (and the book's title), the River-Horse. He and his companion leave the Atlantic coast from New York harbor in the hopes of following the routes of the great explorers.

The Ten Challenges is based on the Ten Commandments, but takes the Commandments and converts each to a challenge we often face in daily life. For instance, "Honor they father and thy mother" is extended to "How do you honor a parent when there is tension between you?"




The speaker was Chowan County Deputy Sheriff Tim Brabble. Brabble, who was in-


