

Refrigerated trucks and freezers for storage were required.

The various North Carolina Food Banks, churches, soup kitchens, shelters and other hunger relief agencies, played a major part in getting the venison from the processor to the needy. This year they've really got their work cut out for them.

Somehow, due in large part to a very active board of directors for the program, things got done and the venison flowed across the state to points where it was needed. A lot of needy people who might have gone hungry last year slept on full stomachs because of dedicated and caring hunters.

This year, with our disastrous storms, there's a special need for food for people who were literally wiped out by flooding.

Venison burger will appeal to many deer hunters (yet another excuse to spend more time in the woods). In talking with some of the hunters who would have liked to have contributed deer that they didn't

need, it became apparent they didn't understand just how or where to go about contributing the deer to the program. Here are directions:

First of all, field dress and bleed the deer just as if you were going to consume the meat yourself. Don't leave it

sitting out in the sun to spoil and keep flies off the exposed meat.


Locally, donated deer meat is being accepted in Perquimans County at Layden Meats, Highway 37, Belvidere, NC 27919, phone (252) 297-2191.
