Parker Chesson, chairman of the **Employment Security Commission** of North Carolina, has announced that the unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) for November rose in 51 counties, fell in 32, and were unchanged in 17.

Chowan County's jobless rate rose slightly, from 2.5% in October to 3.0%

Unemployment rates posted by other area counties for November



"Unadjusted unemployment rates show employment and unemployment conditions at the time the data was collected," Chesson said. "Generally, they are not used in determining the significance of economic


