Basketball Camp

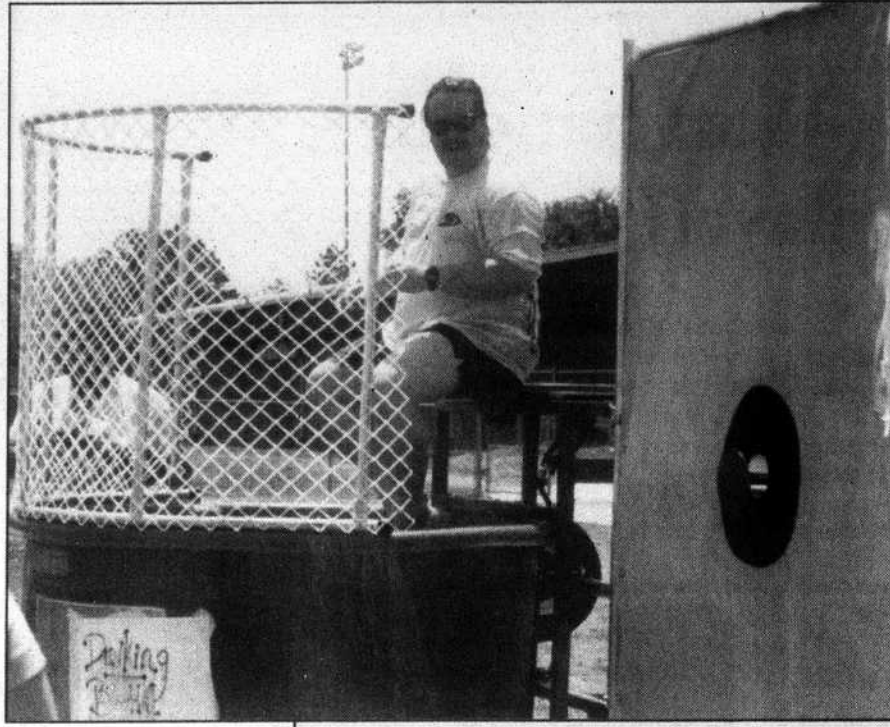
A summer basketball camp will be held from June 19-23. Youth entering kindergarten through rising sixth-graders are eligible to participate in the program.

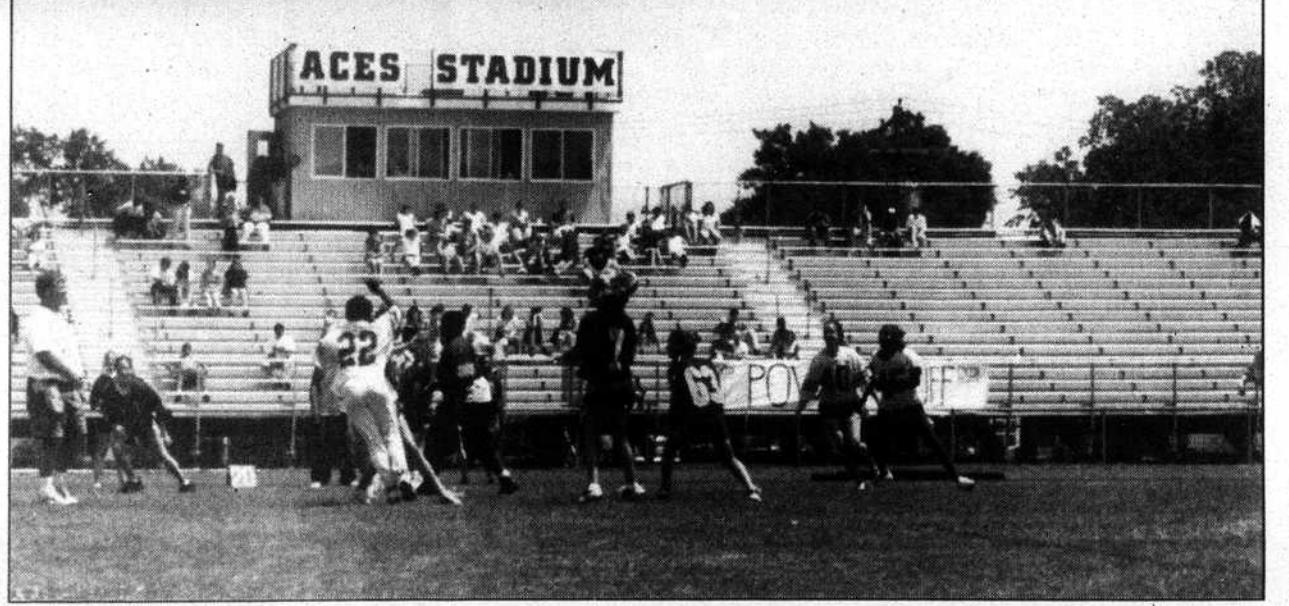

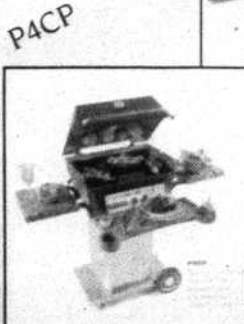

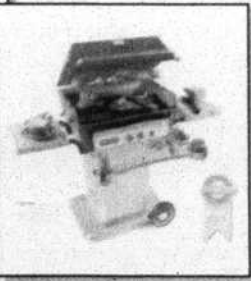
