Becoming Madame Mao by Anthea Min is historical fiction based on the life of the best-known woman in post-war China. Born the unwanted daughter of a concubine, young Yunhe refused to have her feet bound, rejected the husband chosen for her, and ran off to join an opera troupe. While working as an actress she met the young Mao Zedong and became part of the Chinese Communist movement, rising to power along with Mao.

Stonehenge: 2000 B.C. by Bernard Cornwell is a story set 4,000 years ago in which three brothers construct a mighty stone temple to appease the gods. Cornwell, well known for his careful research, has recreated civilization as it might have been, a process so through that

When she announces plans to remarry, her children strenuously object. She decides to write a memoir that she hopes will clarify parts of her life that she had not revealed before.

A New York City policeman sees the opportunity to avenge his father's murder in *A Slow Burning* by Stanley Pottinger. Then his girlfriend is critically injured and the only doctor who can possibly save her is a bitter rival. Reviews say this book will appeal to Michael Crichton and Robin Cook fans.

Joanna Trollope's *Marrying the Mistress* is told from the point of view of the men in a judge's family. The judge announces that he is leaving his wife of forty-something years to marry his mistress of seven years. The family's reactions range from shocked to bemused, but no one is left untouched.

While I Was Gone by Sue Miller is the new Oprah book club choice. A woman who has changed her identity unexpectedly encounters someone from

her past. Now a practicing veterinarian, she had previously spent several years in a commune where a terrible murder occurred.

The Coldest War: A Memoir of Korea is by columnist James Brady, a Marine Corps lieutenant in command of a rifle platoon. Photographs of the rugged hills cloaked in snow and the Dog Company Christmas tree exemplify the struggle and the spirit of the men who fought there.

Reflections in Black: A History of Black Photographers 1840 to the Present is an assemblage of images by and of African-Americans since photography's earliest days. From everyday events to historical moments, author Deborah Willis has chosen vivid images that portray a diverse black experience.

Four new audio-tapes for your headphones are *Big Stone Gap* by Adriana Trigiani, *Night Gardening* by E.L. Swann, *The Reader* by Bernhard Schlink and *One Fine Day the Rabbi Bought a Cross* by Harry Kemelman.

Shepard-Pruden Memorial Library is incorporating writing into the Summer Reading Program. Each child attending the first program was given a notebook purchased by the Albemarle Literary Center and encouraged to keep a summer journal.

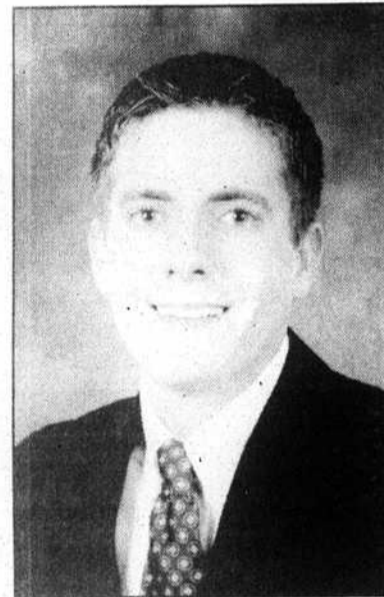
Heiniger new member of NCSU honor society

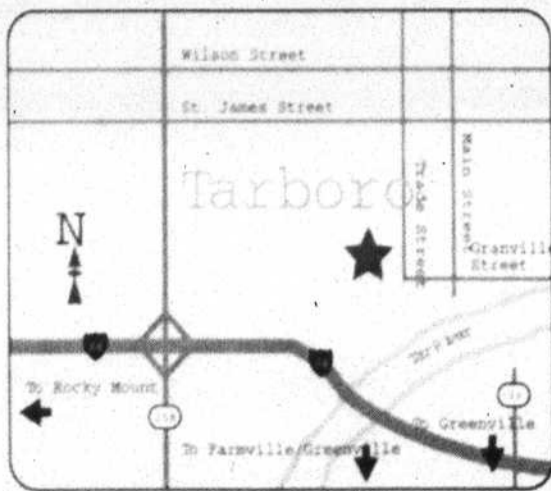
