Among those are landscaping classroom carpeting, a school sign, an extended bus canopy, a studentlearning kitchen and fencing.

The cost of the remaining items totals almost \$193,000 and those items will be prioritized as needed, Smith said.

However, a contingency in the amount of \$386,000 could be used to pay for those items, he said.

'We will look back (at the possi-

bility of including the items) and we may use the contingency fund to accommodate them, but we probably can't (afford) to do them all," Smith said.

Certain items such as landscaping could probably be done by the school system, Smith added


