Chowan County youth serves as a Governor's Page at Public Instruction

Arkeem LeCoy Fleming of Edenton participated in the Governor's Page Program for the week of Oct. 9-13 in Raleigh. Fleming spent a week gaining valuable life experience and providing administrative support as a page for the Department of Public Instruction.

The Governor's Page Program provides students with an opportunity to gain knowledge of the roles and functions of state government. During the week, pages have a chance to attend press conferences, observe commission meetings and participate in a discussion with Governor Hunt on current issues and events. Pages also assist in day-to-day office operations. Some of their responsibilities include delivering legislative bills, filing documents, assisting in mass mailings, answering telephones and delivering agency messages.

Pages also tour at least one of the following state government buildings each day: the Capitol, the Legislative Building, the Executive Mansion, the Supreme Court, the Museum of Art, and the NC Correctional Institute for Women.

"The page program is a unique opportunity for students," said Gov. Hunt. "Our young people gain a better understanding of various government agencies by discovering firsthand how our government works and by playing an active role in the daily tasks of our offices."

Fleming is the son of Barbara Harris Fleming. He is a senior at John A. Holmes High School.

The one-week program is open to high school students between the ages of 15 and 18, who are in good academic standing at their schools. Application forms are available year-round, but appointments are made on a first-come, first-serve basis.
