Newspapers can be used for children on all grade levels. It can be marked, cut and colored - important to young children who learn by seeing and doing.

Studies have shown that students who study the newspaper in school have a greater knowledge of current events, are more politically aware, have positive attitudes toward school, know more about the

world at large and improve their reading skills and verbal interactions.

Unlike a historical novel a newspaper is the only text the majority of children will continue to read throughout their lives, a living textbook!













