



registered Republicans, compared to 2,330 Unaffiliated and eight as Libertarian, according to the Board of Elections.

Since Jan. 1, 183 Republicans have voted early, compared to 166 Democrats. Unaffiliated voters account for 137 early votes with only 15 of them choosing to vote in the Democrat prima-

At 43, more Chowan Democrats have switched party affiliations, records show.

Thirty-one have gone Unaffiliated and changed to Republican. Nine Republicans have switched, six to Unaffiliated and three to Demo-

Only 11 Unaffiliated have changed their party, eight to Republican and three to Democrat.

Chowan has four candidates in the GOP primary and no Democrats for its primary.

Tag sale grows bigger

Benefits go to the Perquimans Rescue room.

Fifteen years ago, the residents of the then fairly new Albemarle Plantation decided to have a tag sale to unload the things they no longer needed.

They also decided the proceeds should go to benefit the Perquimans County Rescue Squad to assist in obtaining equipment and upgrading the skill level of the personnel.

The first sale took place in the vacant lot next to the Family Dollar and the "bargains" were put out on a couple of tables and laid on sheets spread on the asphalt — and the shoppers unpacked the boxes.

The next year the sale was held in the garage bays at the Perquimans County Rescue Squad at First and Ainsley streets. Eventually, as donations increased over the years, holding it there created a logistics nightmare of sorts. Ambulances had to be moved out of the building so that the "bargains" could be carried in.

Tables were set up and everything had to be unpacked, distributed around, and then priced. In those years at the squad many items had to be left out overnight as the inside space was full.

In the wee hours of the morning on sale day, the furniture pieces were put out on the lawn and the workers watched as the line started to form well before the 8 a.m. start

Squad members made breakfast for everyone (and still do by the way) before the sale began. Many items were still hidden in boxes, under the tables, at the start because there just wasn't enough space to display it all up top. As the tables emptied more was put out.

Fast forward to four years ago (2008) when the sale moved to the Perquimans County Recreation Center on Granby Street. BOY WHAT A DIFFER-ENCE! By then many more people had moved to Albemarle Plantation and the volume of everything

seemed to have doubled - but now they had the

Anything and everything can be found from Christmas/other holiday items, to framed art, wall décor, mirrors, luggage, sports equipment, toys, towels, sheets, decorative pillows, bedspreads, craft items, dishes, glasses, pots and pans, serving platters, coffee mugs, lamps, home décor, purses, furniture and more furniture, televisions and more televisions, computers, printers, kitchen appliances, tools, books, yard equipment, mowers, boating items you name it they've got it.

There's also a special area right inside the door for jewelry and unique/ collectible/antique items the stuff, that's a little more "special."

The icing on the cake, so to speak, is that the ladies in Albemarle Plantation generously bake a variety of delicious treats to further tempt you: cakes, pies, cookies, brownies, scones...well, you get the

Operation CATSnip slates three clinics

Operation CatSNIP, a low-cost, spay-neuter clinic for cats, is now taking applications for the following clinic dates: Friday, May 25; Friday June 8; and

Saturday, July 14.

Don't delay; appointments fill up fast!

Cats must be pre-registered and prepaid. Checkin is from 9 a.m. until 9:30 a.m. on the morning of the clinic. Pick-up is between 4 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. that af-

The cost is just \$19 for the male neutering procedure and \$39 for a female spay. If the cat does not have a current rabies vac-

cination, a one-year rabies shot is \$8 additional.

Surgery includes a general health check. Rabies and other vaccinations, FIV tests, deworming, ear mite treatment and flea/ tick medication are available at additional charge.

The clinics are being sponsored by AWARE (Animal Welfare of the Albemarle Region Every day). Call AWARE at 866-315-6032 for registration or info.

Clinic services are available to any resident of Perquimans, Chowan, Gates, Bertie, or Washington County Limit two cats per household per clinic. Cat must be at least 4 months of age.
