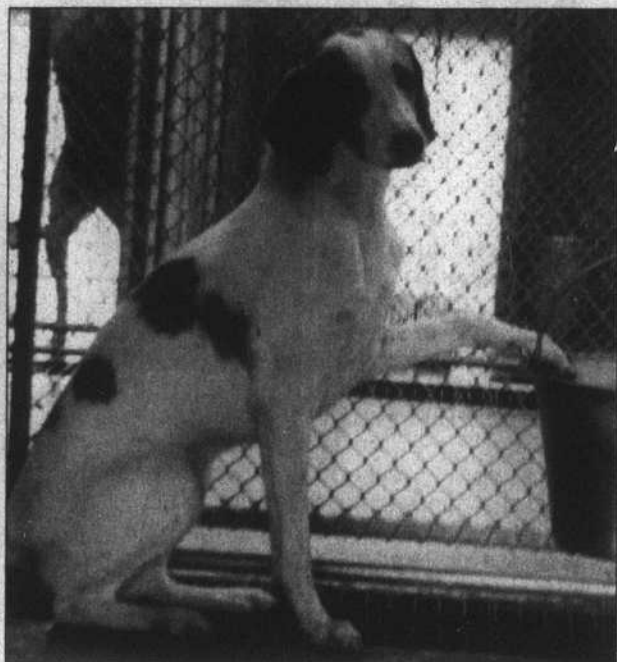

LIONS SCHOLARSHIP

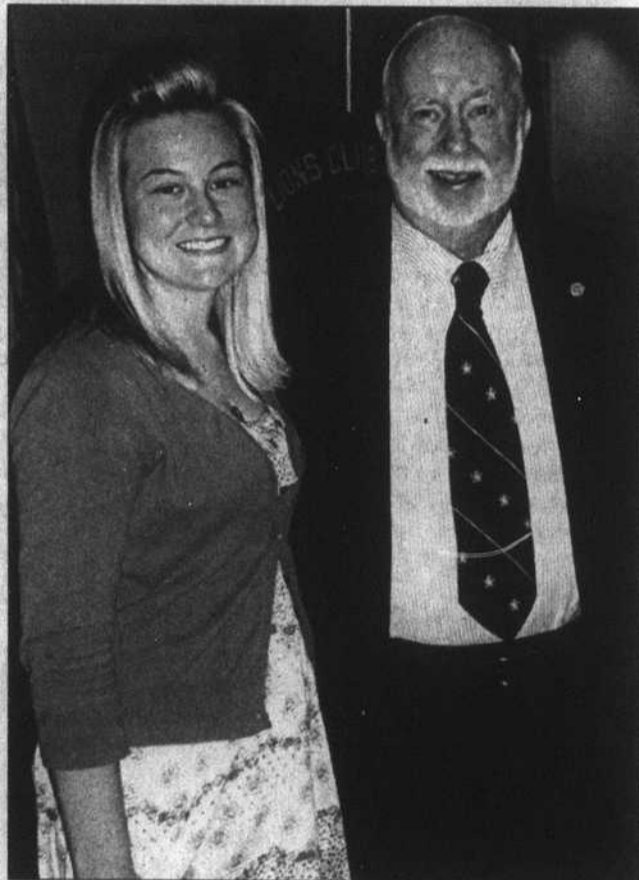
