### Steinburg: Restrictive wind law not likely to pass

A bill that would severely limit new wind power projects in the state will not become law this year, predicts Rep. Bob Steinburg.

The N.C. Senate passed the Military Operations Protection Act on Monday with the support of Sen. Bill
