have the power to remove any historical markers. If the law is changed, do you think the Confederate monument at the tip of South Broad Street should be removed? Why

or why not?

What needs to be removed is not the Confederate monument but the hatred and prejudices some of us associate with the existing monument. The removal of 'the Confederate monument is not going to free our hearts of past injustices. We all need to think of the future and move forward together.

Do you support the town's efforts to attract a Brew Pub to the waterfront? Why or why not?

Absolutely! The Brew Pub has the possibilities of being an economic development catalyst within our community. It would help our local economy generate additional income, improve tourism, provide a waterfront restaurant for our citizens and

guests, add jobs, and expand our existing tax base.

In general terms, what are your ideas to improve/ repair infrastructure? And would you support a tax increase to pay for these repairs?

The Town of Edenton needs to take steps to improve the safety and quality of our drinking water, upgrade the wastewater treatment plant, expand the capacity of the East Water Street storm sewer pump station, upgrade water treatment plants at Beaver Hill and Freemason, and resurface the many streets that need attention.

I do not support a tax increase to pay for these improvements. I believe the costs and work involved

could best be addressed through grant funding, USDA loans, and our own skillful public works staff.

Do you think Edenton can support another grocery store?

Yes, I believe most certainly Edenton can support another grocery store. Edenton has demonstrated in the past that we can support more than one grocery store (i.e., Winn-Dixie and IGA). We have a proven market to attract other grocery store chains.

What steps do you think Town Council can do, while working closely with the police department, to reduce crime?

The Town Council can take steps to encourage and support the "Neighborhood

Watch" program, reduce the number of abandoned houses that provide a safe haven for criminals, create a "Crime Free Agreement" for land-lords, and improve the Police Community Partnership (i.e., Citizen Watch groups and Personal Police Zones).

Do you think the Confederate monument at the tip of South Broad Street should be removed? Why?

We look forward to a community that acknowledges the past, but is not held captive by those preceding events. The Confederate monument is not truly a memorial and is really a reminder of a period in American history when some citizens were not afforded an equal opportunity to succeed.

It is important to acknowledge that on July 23, 2015, the state of North Carolina adopted the Historic Artifact Management and Patriotism Act, which precludes "permanent removal" of our town's Confederate monument. Notwithstanding this law, I firmly believe that the statute should be replaced with the construction of a monument that references a diverse cross-section of our fallen service members. However, until there is an opportunity to achieve this ultimate goal via the repeal of the current law, I will seek to add a memorial or plaque that honors all men and women who paid the ultimate price for our free-
