can people.' U.S. Rep. Walter Jones, a Farmville Republican, was one of 13 Republicans who voted against the legislation. Jones said he was reluctant to vote no, but had to because it's expected to add up to \$2 trillion to the national debt.

"I'm all for tax reform, but it must grow the economy, not the debt," Jones said in a news release. The additional debt would likely be borrowed from "potential foreign adversaries like China, and then put on the backs of American taxpayers.

"That's at least an additional \$12,000 burden for every household in America," Jones said. "With federal debt already at \$20 trillion, and deficit spending adding \$666 billion to that debt just this past year alone, this
