According to police, officers were notified of an incident in the 1000 block of Badham Road Wednesday about 10:22 p.m. Wednesday, June 19. When they arrived, they found Riddick, 32, of Edenton, critically injured from a gunshot. Riddick was transported to Vidant Chowan Hospital in Edenton, where he died from his injuries, police
